Introduction:

The International policy will develop links with schools in other countries across the world to broaden the experience of our students.

The Aims of the Policy are:

- To equip children, young people and adults for life in a global society and work in a global economy.
- To provide students with an informed awareness of countries, cultures and languages other than our own so that they respect and value different cultures and beliefs.
- To provide an added opportunity for the promotion of equal opportunities, racial equality and Citizenship.
- To raise awareness and appreciation of other environments and what is happening in the world.
- To develop cross-curricular activities with an international theme for all students.

The Policy

The school will:

- Provide curriculum subjects and cross-curricular projects such as the British Council project – Comenius.
- Work with partner schools to share ideas and best practice in the United Kingdom.
- Work on The Youth Sport Trust projects – Ideals, Dreams and Teams.
- Organise student/staff visits to places of cultural interest in the UK and abroad.
- Organise student exchanges and email contacts with students in partner schools overseas.
- Offer a range of appropriate language options for all students to study.
- Arrange International Days.
